What is Alternative Education?



Alternative Education is a vague term that refers to the placement of disruptive and lowperforming students in a non-traditional classroom setting. The unbridled use of alternative placements can lead a child on a dangerous path toward incarceration. Ineffective programs that operate as penal institutions without proper student supports only propel students deeper into the pipeline. In order to deconstruct the school-toprison pipeline, we must focus on the point of entry, including alternative education placements.

What are some common examples of reasons for a student to be placed in an alternative education program?



- Possession, distribution, or use of alcohol and/or drugs;
- Physical altercations or fights; 0
- Possession or use of a weapon; 0
- Possession or use of a firearm; 0
- Continual academic failure; 0
- Disruptive verbal behavior and, 0
- Chronic truancy. 0

How can we re-invent Alternative Education Programs?



- Implement positive behavior supports to effectively discipline students, many of whom often also have special education and special behavioral needs.
- Remove law enforcement from alternative settings. 0
- Increase legislative oversight of alternative programs. 0
- Involve parents and communities in alternative programming decisions.
- Broaden eligibility for more types of "untraditional" students to benefit from alternative education programs.
- Clarify state and district roles and responsibilities, including accountability.
- Increase support and encourage innovation in programming and methodologies.
- Ensure high-quality staff and instruction.
- Enhance student support services by partnering alternative programs with community resources.
- Enrich funding and accountability for per pupil funding of alternative programs.
